The future of missionary work among Japanese nationals in San Diego depends, above all, on the growth of the two churches currently operating in Oceanside and La Jolla. There is no time to rest or stop. If I were doing this by my own strength, I would eventually stop. But the Holy Spirit never stops. He will never cease along the way. Until we reach the Kingdom, I want to keep running until the end, just as Elijah was taken up to heaven in a chariot of fire and horses. In my case, it is "between joy and limits."

Regarding the caravan team, I actually had no intention of recruiting them every year. However, over the past three years, we have welcomed the caravan team every year, and both the receiving side and the sending side have experienced great blessings. Especially since non-Christian high school students have said that the church's evangelistic event was the most fun! There's no reason not to invite them. Plus, Major League Baseball is popular, so even more participants from Japan will likely join. Please start planning and saving now. We look forward to seeing you next year!
